- To ensure each student is being supported based on their individual needs.
- Easily target where students are in the process.
- To better align students with opportunities.
- Ensure successful postsecondary enrollment.
- Accurately measure growth towards goals/outcomes.
- Provide insight on areas students need support most.
- Meet data requirements for role.
- To ensure reported data is accurate.

#### **Student Roster**

#### Let's Work!

#### **Student Roster**

#### **Creating Systems**

- Create a system amongst your team of how and when your will update your student rosters
  - Enrollment changes: new enrollment/transfers
  - Daily/Weekly/Biweekly
  - Responsible for the updates
  - Responsible for pulling FAFSA/State Aid status
  - Responsible for supporting students with creating MISSG portals
  - Responsible for ensuring students update their selected school

## What things are required to complete a FAFSA application?

The only items required to "complete" a FAFSA application is the SSN and FSAID of both parent and student.

Who is a parent? Biological and/or adoptive step parent. No one else goes on the FAFSALL

Challenges

#### **Parents Parents**

If we know this is the challenge, this is who we should be targeting for 1-on-1 support not just students

- Make time available to support parents
- Work with students and make them call their parents
- Have the student complete student section and create process for parents to complete parent section

Submitted vs. Completed

FAFSA application is not complete until the students application record shows:

#### PROCESSED SUCCESSFULLY

There is no other undisputed indicator of application completions. SAR reports are automatically produced when submissions are made and email regarding processing is just that it's been processed not the results.

#### **Rejects/Verification Prep**

Have your students share/send screenshots of the application status provided within the application. This will also open other indicators.

#### Rejects/Processing Delays

- Rejects and/or issues will be indicated
- Making corrections/adding schools

#### Verification Prep

- Student falls under independent status
- IRS data retrieval not used by student
- IRS data retrieval not used by parent

The most important tracking component is the staff tracking list of statuses and needed docs!

#### Other applications

At highly selective schools that require more than the FAFSA applications, their secondary application are just as important as the FAFSA application.

Failure to complete secondary applications can result in students missing out on tens of thousands of dollars. These applications are used to determine institutional need-based aid.

Federal aid: \$6345+\$5500=\$11,845

#### Virtual Support for App Completion

Connecting with Students

- **Classrooms:** Find classes where students are not just English classes or recommended classes based on this non-virtual world
- Social media/incentive campaigns: Money typically used for events use it for incentives and marketing campaigns
- Students in Contact: Make sure their items are completed
- Create Space for Getting things Done



#### Virtual Support for App Completion

**Building Internal Peer Leaders** 

- **Student grouping:** Athletics, Academics, Extracurricular Activities, Social Engagement, Counselor Engagement
- Within groups put a small group of students "in charge" and appoint adult support for group.
- Run Small competitions and incentives for groups and leaders
- Allow these leaders to run social media, events, and activities to get their peers engaged

#### Virtual Support for App Completion

Virtual Support events

- Consistency will be key. One off events, offered last minute will not be the most effective in this virtual world.
- Use what's important to them to draw them and use these spaces as an opportunity to get things done
- Apps not completed must be completed within 30 days of the initial start
- Be creative, utilize students, mobile app completion, breakout rooms for one-on-one
